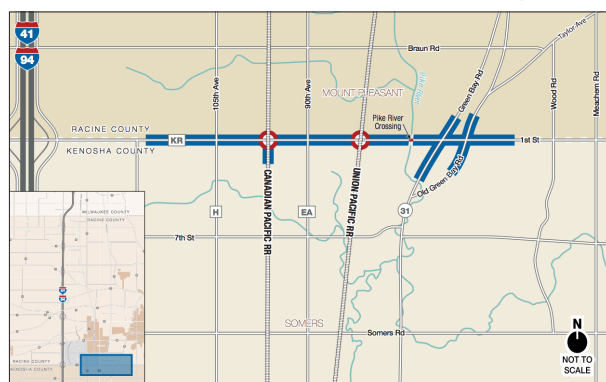


# COUNTY KR ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS

JULY 2018

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation is preparing design plans and conducting environmental reviews to reconstruct County KR over a distance of about 2.8 miles, from County H to Old Green Bay Road, in Racine and Kenosha Counties.

## PROJECT OVERVIEW:

The project will:

- **Upgrade the existing two-lane rural roadway to a four-lane urban roadway** from County H to Old Green Bay Road;
- **Construct new bridges** to replace the existing two at-grade railroad crossings;
- **Build a new structure** build replace the existing bridge over the Pike River; and
- **Improve traffic operations** in all directions at the County KR intersections with WIS 31 and Old Green Bay Road.

## EXISTING NEED:

The existing roadway infrastructure is not adequate to handle the increased travel demand expected from planned economic development and land uses.

- The existing two-lane, rural roadway handles about 9,000 - 9,500 vehicles per day.
- Traffic volume is **expected to more than double** in coming years to 18,000 - 20,000 vehicles per day.

In addition to meeting traffic demands, the reconstruction will be designed to maximize safety, address existing road inefficiencies, and create effective linkages.

## PROPERTY OWNERS WITHIN THE PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY:

WisDOT is still in process on design plans and the final right of way plat. Beginning in 2019, upon completion and receipt of these plans, **Racine County will select and work with an outside team of real estate specialists to reach out to impacted homeowners** to acquire the needed public right of way in Racine County.
